HAVE YOUR SAY ON WAGGA WAGGA BASE HOSPITAL – STAGE THREE

The redevelopment of Wagga Wagga Base Hospital (WWBH) has reached the next stage with the community invited to view the plans for stage three.

NSW Health Minister Brad Hazzard said this is an exciting step in the \$431million redevelopment of WWBH.

“Stage one and stage two are complete and already providing world class health services to the local community,” Minister Hazzard said.

“Stage one delivered 30 additional mental health beds and was completed in 2013.

“Stage two delivered the acute services building including a new emergency department, operating theatres, women’s and children’s inpatient units, new ICU and a rooftop helipad – completed in 2016.

“But it doesn’t stop here – stage three is already underway.

“The State Significant Development (SSD) proposal for stage three is on public exhibition until August 15 and it’s your chance to get online and have your say.”

Stage three of the redevelopment will include:

- Ambulatory care building for rehabilitation, mental health, aged care and dialysis treatment
- Car parking for an additional 107 cars and
- Ground level and bridge connections to existing buildings

“Also included in stage three is the relocation of BreastScreen NSW to the Hospital so it can be easily accessed by more local women,” Mr Hazzard said.

“Once complete, WWBH will be a shining beacon of light for all rural and regional hospitals,” Mr Hazzard said.
