Building for the future

The \$431million Wagga Wagga Health Service Redevelopment has reached another exciting milestone, with a call for tenders for the construction of Stage 3 - the Ambulatory Care Building.

The latest artist's impressions for Stage 3 were unveiled by the NSW Minister for Health Brad Hazzard during a visit to the construction site in September 2018.


The announcement of the successful tenderer for construction of the Stage 3 building is expected in late 2018. Construction work should start early 2019.

Construction will take about two years, with commissioning in 2021.

A key aspect of Stage 3 is the relocation of BreastScreen NSW in early 2019 into a refurbished building in Berry Street in the heart of Wagga Wagga, ensuring improved access for eligible women seeking life saving, free breast screening.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is in Stage 3?

The third stage of the Wagga Wagga Health Service (WWHS) Redevelopment involves the construction of a new Ambulatory Care Building linked to the new hospital. The building will include: aged care and rehabilitation inpatient beds, older person's mental health, renal dialysis unit, Ambulatory clinics, outpatient rehabilitation and allied health, education and training facilities and additional underground and on grade car parking.

Stage 3 also includes the relocation of BreastScreen NSW to a refurbished building in Berry Street in Wagga Wagga's central business district.

What was involved with Stages 1 and 2?

Stage 2 delivered the new Acute Services Building including an emergency department, operating theatres, women's and children's inpatient units, new intensive care unit and a rooftop helipad in 2017. Stage 1 delivered a new Mental Health Building completed in 2013.

How will Stage 3 construction impact the delivery of healthcare on the campus?

The Redevelopment has been planned through a number of distinct construction stages. Health services have continued and will be operational during construction.

Health services on the Stage 3 construction site have been moved into other buildings and facilities on the health campus and at Peter Street in Wagga Wagga's central business district where they continue to offer services to patients.

Does Stage 3 involve more health services?

Yes. Expanded health services include: Aged Care Beds; Rehabilitation beds; Older Person's Mental Health Inpatient Unit; Renal Dialysis Unit; Ambulatory Clinics, Rehabilitation and Allied Health, including Primary and Community Health Outpatients, Prosthetics and Orthotics, Mental Health, Drug and Alcohol, and Oral Health services; a new education area including library, conference rooms and a lecture theatre; Extended Hours Services Workforce and office accommodation.

When will it be completed?

WWHS Redevelopment Stage 3 construction is due to commence in Q1 2019. Construction will take approximately 2 years, with operational commissioning in 2021.

What about car parking?

Stage 3 provides an additional 100 spaces.
