The Wagga Wagga Health Service (WWHS) campus redevelopment is progressing with a new forecourt taking shape.

Wagga Wagga Rural Referral Hospital (WWRRH) Director Helen Cooper said the forecourt and car park will be completed by the end of 2017.

“The completion of the forecourt along with more parking spaces signals the end of stages 1 and 2 of the \$282.1 million hospital redevelopment,” Ms Cooper said.

Ms Cooper said Stage 3 planning and early works are advancing.

STAGE 3 — WAGGA WAGGA HEALTH SERVICE



Stage 3 finalises the redevelopment of the Wagga Wagga Health Service by providing a new Ambulatory Services Building that will include specialist services such as Renal and outpatient clinics.

Other services include Community Health, Aboriginal Health, Education and Library, Medical Records, Information Technology Department and Allied Health.

There will also be a new Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit and increased Medical and Aged Care capacity.

At a cost of \$170 million, Stage 3 is expected to be completed by 2020.

Expect to see a lot of changes at the Wagga Wagga Health Service (WWHS) campus as early works for Stage 3 get underway.

Some of the changes include new pedestrian access to the Emergency Department and Mental Health Unit.
