

Façade pays homage to Murrumbidgee

The colours of the landscape along Murrumbidgee River have inspired the exterior colours of the new Stage 3 Ambulatory Care Building.

The colours include a mixture of greens, gold, grey and white.



The Local Health District and the Murrumbidgee River are intrinsically linked so it is appropriate that we draw its colours for this significant health building.

The colour concept for the Stage 3 building façade has been developed in three parts: firstly the creation of the colour palette and imagery; the imagery was then applied to the building's façade; and finally pixelated to create the façade design.

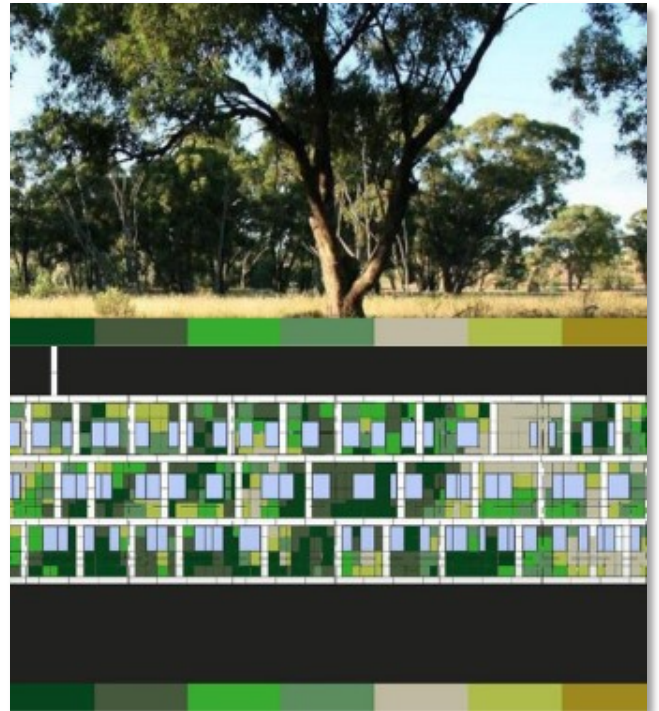


Photo: (top) An image from the banks of Murrumbidgee River with colour palette and (bottom) the same image pixelated on new Stage 3 building façade with colour palette.

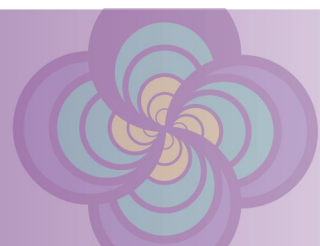

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Stage 3 construction update

The final touches are being put on the ground floor concrete slab of the new Stage 3 Ambulatory Care Building.

The 4th and final concrete pour for the first floor slab took place on Wednesday 4 September.

Known as a suspended slab, the ground floor is supported by more than 60 supporting concrete columns with a total of 1 380 cubic metres of concrete poured for this slab.

As the scaffolding creeps above the top of the hoarding, attention is now turning to the Level 1 concrete slab and its supporting columns.

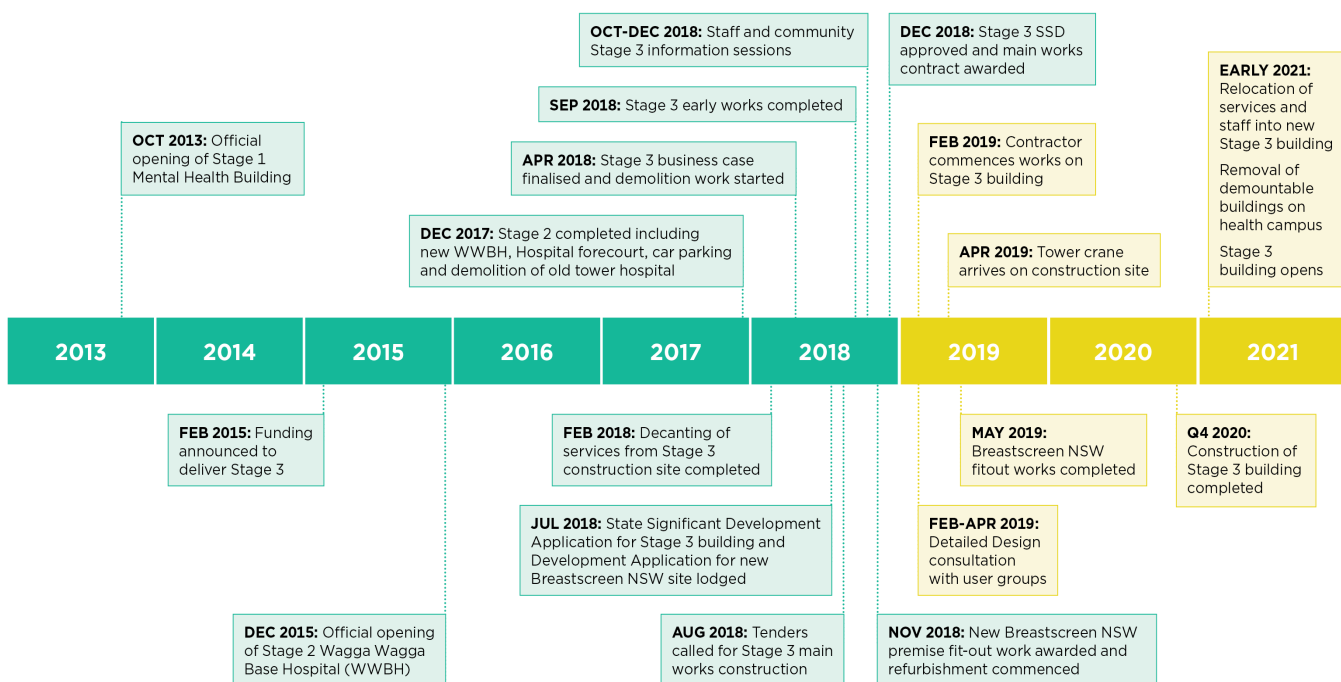
On the ground floor slab

- 1 389 metres³ of concrete poured
- 4 concrete pours
- 62 columns

A lift cavity and three stairwells will intersect with each level.

CPB Contractors Pty Ltd was awarded the contract to construct the new Stage 3 building which will be linked to the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital at ground level and Level 4. Concrete has also been laid in the basement area.
