CPB Contractors was granted access to the Stage 3 construction site on the Wagga Wagga Health Service campus during February, allowing the team to start early works.

These works include establishing the site with fencing and site sheds, undertaking site surveys and starting earthworks.

This activity will be followed by the start of foundation works.

Access to the site by construction traffic will be from Docker Street.

Traffic controls will be put in place to ensure the safety of pedestrians and local traffic.

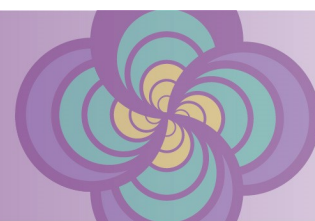

Further sessions on the Detailed Design of the multi-storey building project will be held in the coming months.

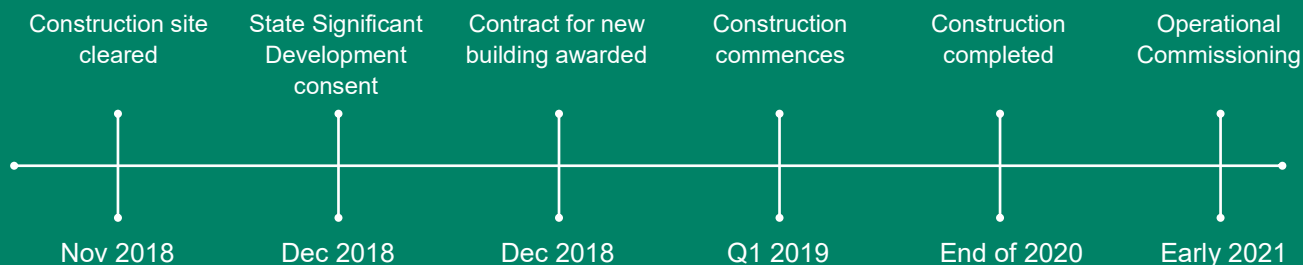
